Remember!

Base adjectives

Base adjectives are normal adjectives that can be modified using other words to make their meaning strong or weak.

Eq.: That's a very good idea. / He was really tired.

Strong adjectives

Strong adjectives cannot be modified with these words because they already have the idea of "very".

Eg.: Your dinner was **absolutely** delicious. / The teacher was **absolutely** furious.
